MYTH #1



ESTIMATED 930,160 U.S. ABORTIONS IN 2020

THERE WERE ONLY 79.161 ADOPTIONS IN 2020

THESE STATS ARE FROM THE NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR ADOPTION WHICH REPORTS NATIONWIDE ADOPTION STATS EVERY FEW YEARS. THEY INCLUDE ALL PRIVATE DOMESTIC AND INTERNATIONAL ADOPTIONS AS WELL AS THOSE OUT OF THE FOSTER CARE SYSTEM. SADLY, ONLY **1 PERCENT** OF LINMARRIED MOTHERS FACING AN LINPLANNED PREGNANCY MAKE A PLAN FOR ADOPTION



IN 2020, THERE WERE 117,470 U.S. FOSTER CHILDREN AWAITING ADOPTION, NEARLY HALF (57,881) WERE ADOPTED.


OF THE 407,493 IN FOSTER CARE 107,333 (OR 26%) WERE REUNITED W/ BIOLOGICAL PARENT(S).



To this day, states provide information only on a voluntary basis. We need federal legislation that makes both abortion and adoption reporting mandatory so we have an accurate picture of what is happening to the most vulnerable among us: our children.
